### **Department 603: Open Dairy Goat Show**

#### **General Rules and Regulations:**

1. This show is sanctioned by the American Dairy Goat Association and their rules shall govern. The Combined Sr. & Jr. doe shows are sanctioned for the following breeds to be shown in this order: Saanens, Nigerian Dwarf, Lamancha, Oberhasli, Recorded Grade, Nubian, AOP (Alpine, Toggenberg, Sables). No horned animals allowed. The combined Sr & Jr. doe shows are not separately sanctioned.
2. Entry fees are \$3.00 per animal and must accompany the entry form. There will be no refund of entry fees for any reasons. No faxed entry forms allowed. Substitutions will be allowed within the same breed and show. There is no limit to the number of animals which can be shown by an exhibitor, but only 2 premiums will be paid per exhibitor per class. Additionally, in order to receive premiums and championship legs, all animals must have readable tattoos. Animals entered in showmanship classes must be entered in their breed classes.
3. No tie stalling will be allowed, exhibitors are responsible for providing enough help to hold animals not in pens or trailers, ringside. There are no pens for open exhibitors. Be prepared to work from your trailer and there will be holding pens ringside while each breed is showing. Some power hookups available. Bring your own power cords and shade. Queen Anne's County 4-H members are not required to pay pen fees, but must pay the entry fees. Exhibitors must furnish their own feed, water, hay and bedding
4. The base date is August 7, 2017 which is the date the animal is to be judged.
5. The original registration certificate is required for all animals six months of age or older and must be shown to the Show Secretary before the start of the show. The original registration or duplicate application stamped by ADGA, or stamped Faxed duplicate application is required for all animals under six months of age and must be shown to the Show Secretary before the show. No copies of the registration certificate or the stamped duplicate application, telegrams or phone calls will be accepted in lieu of the original certificate.
6. Animals must be on the grounds and checked in by 8a.m. Judging will begin at 9 a.m. All animals must be provided with a collar.
7. The show committee, QA County Fair Board, Queen Anne's County 4-H park, and the ADGA, will not be responsible for loss, damage, or accident to any person, animal or property.
8. The show order is subject to change at the discretion of the show chairman, if needed to facilitate the progress of the show. However, in no event will the show start before 9:00AM.

**Junior Doe Classes:**

- 8 - Jr. Kid 0-3 months
- 9 - Intermediate Kid – 3-6 months
- 10 - Senior Kid – 6-12 months
- 11 - Dry Yearling – 12-24 months

Best Doe in Show will be chosen from does chosen Grand Champion. Does winning Grand Champion MUST compete in the Best in Show class or will forfeit their championship leg won at this show.

Best Udder: 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> udder to be placed in each milking doe class and best udder per breed will be chosen from the champion lineup. No best udder in show will be awarded. No additional premiums for best udder will be awarded.
